## SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR IOSEPA CAMPING

- 1. This is a sacred place to all of us and to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, please show respect to our Kupuna who we honor here. No alcohol, drugs, tobacco, profanity or vulgarity. No loud music.
- 2. No guns in camp or surrounding property.
- 3. Drive slowly. No off-road vehicles, ATVs, or motorcycles. Do not park on the pavilion or park where you are blocking the entrances/exits to the pavilion.
- 4. Maintain social distance, especially this year. If you decide to camp, we suggest you space yourself from others, at least 25 feet apart. Meals are on your own.
- 5. If you must bring your pets they need to be on a leash at all times and please clean up their mess.
- 6. Quiet time 10 pm 6 am. (In respect to the ranchers who need their quiet too)
- 7. BE AWARE OF THE COUNTY FIRE RESTRICTIONS. If fires are allowed, fires must be in designated fire ring areas only. If you need to create a new fire ring, dig a pit at least 6-12 inches deep, surround it with stones and clear the area10 ft. around the ring. Make the ring at least 50 ft. from any structures. Clean out fire pit for next person to use.
- 8. Carry out everything you brought in. Take lots of pictures, make lots of memories, and leave Iosepa better than it was when you arrived.
